José Luis Solache appointed President of the Board of Education

The Lynwood Unified School District Board of Education unanimously voted last night to appoint José Luis Solache as President of the Board of Education. Mr. Solache previously served the District as Vice President and Clerk of the Board of Education.

Mr. Solache's appointment as President is historical for a number of reasons, such as the fact that he is a graduate of Lindbergh Elementary School, Hosler Middle School and Lynwood High School. In addition, he has received his Bachelor's degree from California State University Dominguez Hills. Mr. Solache was first elected to serve on the Board of Education in 2003, becoming the youngest Latino member to serve the Board of Education.

In his acceptance speech, Mr. Solache defined the spirit of his Presidency as a focus on customer service. Mr. Solache challenged District staff to better meet the needs of students, parents and the community. He is also committed to serving the needs of teachers, administration and all staff to move the District forward.

Mr. Solache stated that "the future of Lynwood Unified School District is bright. We need to build on the success of the new school openings and gains in the elementary test scores that have been made".

At the same meeting, the Board of Education took action and voted to appoint Mrs. Guadalupe R. Rodriguez as Vice President. Mrs. Rodriguez previously served as Clerk of the Board of Education.
